Student Success Fund


In November 2022, San Francisco voters passed Proposition G. This legislation amends the City Charter to provide additional set aside money for the School District from existing City funds, to be placed in a new Student Success Fund (Fund).

Presents schools and communities with a few opportunities:

- An opportunity to receive long term funding for innovative and effective strategies necessary for all students to achieve academic success and social/emotional wellness at their school sites.
- A chance to accomplish their goals in deep collaboration with students, parents, educators, and staff of community-based organizations, ensuring that all stakeholders have regular input and that these experts are centered in decision making processes.

Funding Buckets

Readiness: Funds to help and support a school to develop a cohesive, inclusive, and aligned plan

Implementation: Funds to help you execute the plan

District Innovation: Funds to support innovative ideas/models that can be scaled and used across the district

Community Schools




What is a Community School?




